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Professor Chi-Tang Ho received his B.S. degree in chemistry from National Taiwan University in Taiwan in 1968. He then went on to receive both his M.A. in 1971 and his Ph.D. in 1974 in organic chemistry from Washington University in St. Louis. After completing two years as a postdoctorate fellow at Rutgers University, he joined the faculty at Rutgers University as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Food Science and is now Distinguished Professor. He has published over 770 refereed journal articles and 223 book chapters, co-edited 34 professional books and is an Associate Editor for Journal of Agricultural and Food Chemistry and an editorial board member for a variety of publications, including the Molecular Nutrition & Food Research and Journal of Functional Foods. He has also won numerous awards including the ACS Award for the Advancement of Application of Agricultural and Food Chemistry, and the Stephen S.
